

# Input from the First Meeting of the Twin Cities Shared Mobility Collaborative

## Overview

This document outlines input from participants in the first meeting of the Twin Cities Shared Mobility Collaborative (SMC), held May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2018 at the McKnight Foundation. It contains both suggestions for what the SMC should address, as well as questions for and about the SMC. The information was gathered using the Mentimeter polling tool during the meeting, and in a post-meeting survey. The first section addresses feedback regarding the role and structure of the Shared Mobility Collaborative. The second section lists feedback about what group members would like to see the SMC cover and broader questions about specific topics.



## Suggested Topics

The following topics were suggested by group members as to what they would like to see the SMC cover, as well as broader questions about specific topics. Of note, these comments were made in the context of a meeting in which other topics had already been identified and discussed. These include mobility hubs, job access, public private partnerships, data sharing, transportation demand management (TDM), and Transportation Network Company (TNC) legislation.

Feedback is roughly grouped by topic area, though these groupings are imperfect. Topics are sorted in ascending order by number of comments given, with the exception of ungrouped comments (listed last).
